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Pope to Papuans: God draws close to those who feel far away

At Sunday Mass in Port Moresby, Pope Francis says that those on the margins of society are united with God and with their fellow humans.

On Sunday morning, Pope Francis celebrated Mass for the faithful in Port Moresby, Papua New Guinea.

It was an early start in the Papuan capital, with Mass beginning at around 8am local time. According to local authorities, around 35,000 people were in attendance, including the nation's Prime Minister, James Marape.

Distance from God: In his homily, Pope Francis reflected on the day's Gospel reading, which describes Jesus' healing of a deaf man with a speech impediment.

The Pope focused in particular on two elements of the story: the "nearness" of Jesus and the "distance" of the deaf man.

The deaf man was distant, the Pope far from the religious centre of Jerusalem. He was "cut off from the
